PLEASE READ THESE REGULATIONS & SECURITY INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY!

- All supporters will undergo an extensive body search prior to entering the stadium. Your cooperation with the stadium security personnel is highly appreciated.
- It is forbidden to exhibit banners, posters, flags or any other form of visual support which uses symbols or emblems that may be an incitation to violence or xenophobia in the stadium. (The club's stewards will be obliged to remove these at once.)
- It is forbidden to be in possession of any kind of weapon or object that can be thrown and that could potentially be used as a weapon. Any person who tries to introduce such objects (including drums, trumpets, megaphones, or any other large object) will be refused entry into the stadium. Small foldable umbrellas are authorised however conventional umbrellas with pointed tip or golf umbrellas will not be allowed in for safety reasons.
- It is forbidden to enter any flag or banner that comes on a pole. Poles and sticks no matter how short or flexible cannot be introduced to the visiting supporter sector. We suggest you remove the poles or sticks from the flags before arriving at the stadium should you wish to enter flags into the stadium.
- It is forbidden to enter any flag or banner that comes on a pole longer than 100 cm. The pole must be light flexible plastic and hollow. Should this not be the case the entry of such banners/flags will only be authorised if the pole is taken out and left behind.
- There are no official deposits or similar arrangements available for leaving any object in the stadium therefore supporters are informed not to bring any objects with them that could risk being refused entry into the stadium. If any forbidden object is brought on the trip, supporters are highly advised to leave these at their hotel or on the bus to not risk

having to leave them upon entry.

- Introduction or sale of alcoholic beverages in the stadium is forbidden.
- Any recipient a spectator may wish to bring into the stadium must fulfil the following conditions of rigidity and volume and have the cap removed before entering the ground. (Recipients/bottles can be no more than 0.5 litres and should be made of soft plastic).
- Bringing torches, fireworks or any pyrotechnic artifacts into the stadium is strictly forbidden. Anyone trying to enter such items will have their ticket confiscated and will be refused entry to the ground. We remind all spectators that it is against the law to bring such items into a sporting arena and infringers will be severely punished. Anyone who makes use of pyrotechnic artifacts inside the stadium compound risks a heavy fine and a jail sentence. If a firework is lit inside the stadium compound, Police will intervene and arrest any person linked to such an infringement.
- It is also forbidden to bring into the stadium any object that could be considered a fire hazard (rolls of toilet paper, large paper posters/banners etc...) or that is too large to ensure the security of the spectators in the stadium

IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE GUIDELINES SUPPORTERS MUST RESPECT THE FOLLOWING

- It is not allowed to throw any type of object between the various sectors of the stadium nor between spectators.
- All visiting supporters should follow instructions from the police and the club's stewards and collaborate while getting to their seating area all together in the stands.
- Arsenal supporters should aim to be at Access Gate 21 by 18:00. Supporters will be allowed to enter the stadium to get

to their seats well on time before the start of the game. Please note that this access closes at 19:00 to be used exclusively as an access to the parking for FC Barcelona Members in cars with a valid parking pass.

- Any Arsenal supporter who did not make it on time to enter through Access 21 will be able to enter through any access gate to the stadium perimeter along with the rest of the FC Barcelona supporters as of 19:15 when the stadium gates open to general public.
- We recommend however that the supporters who arrive after 19:00 to make their way directly to Access 18 and 19 which are the closest to the gates 46, 50, 51 and 52 which are the entrance turnstiles reserved for the visiting team supporters to access to their seating area.
- Arsenal supporters will be searched at their entrance to the ground as a measure of security for themselves and others in the stadium.
- Instructions from the Stewards and Police officials should be followed at all times.
- In case of infringement of any of these rules and/or disturbing public order, the Club can refuse entry or have the person or responsables removed from the stadium.
- During the control at the stadium gates, any person who is considered to be drunk or under the influence of alcohol or drugs, can be refused entry or can be removed from the premises if causing disturbance once inside.
- FC Barcelona reserves itself the right to carry out whatever action deemed necessary to maintain a safe and orderly match organisation.

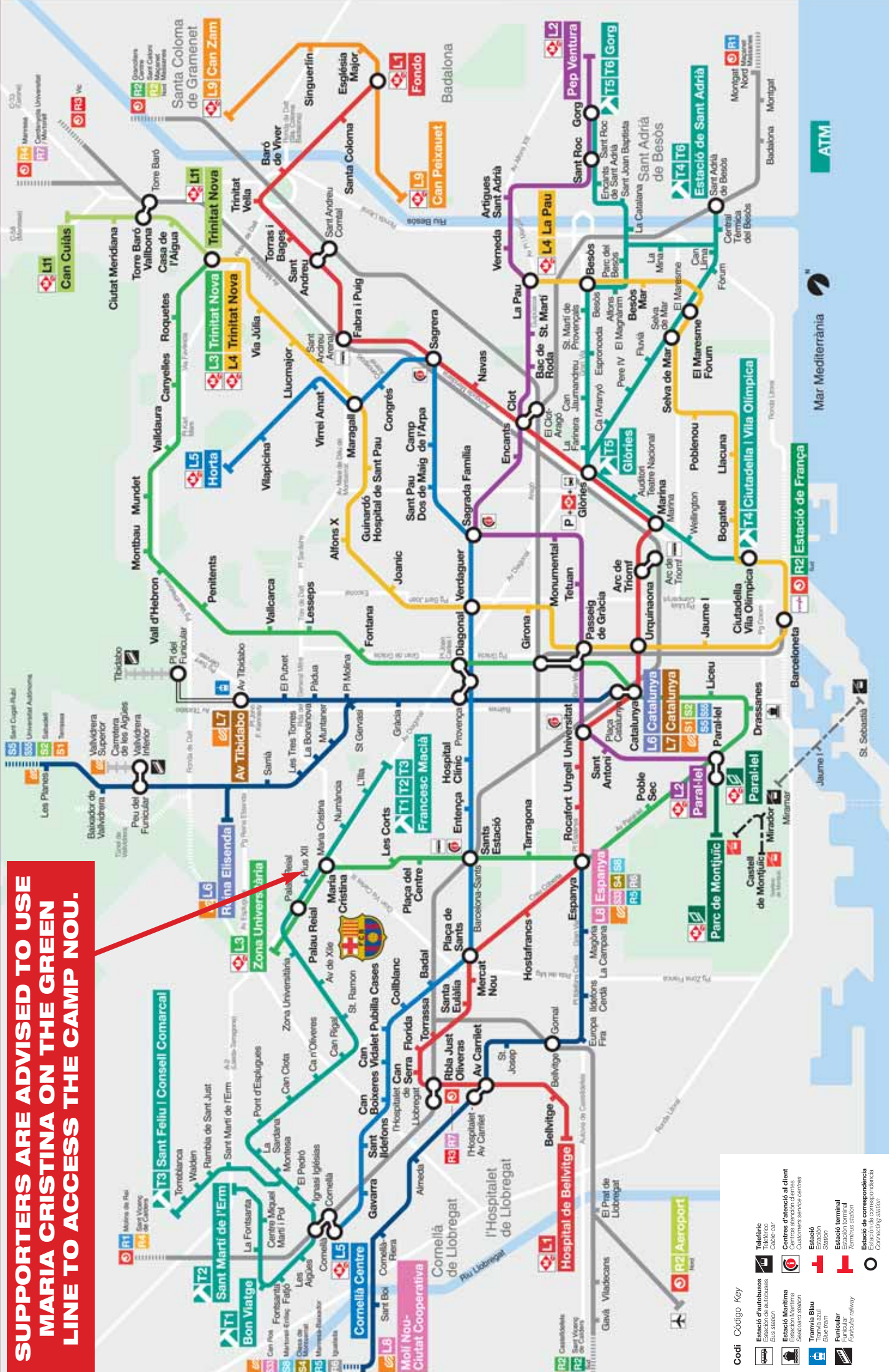

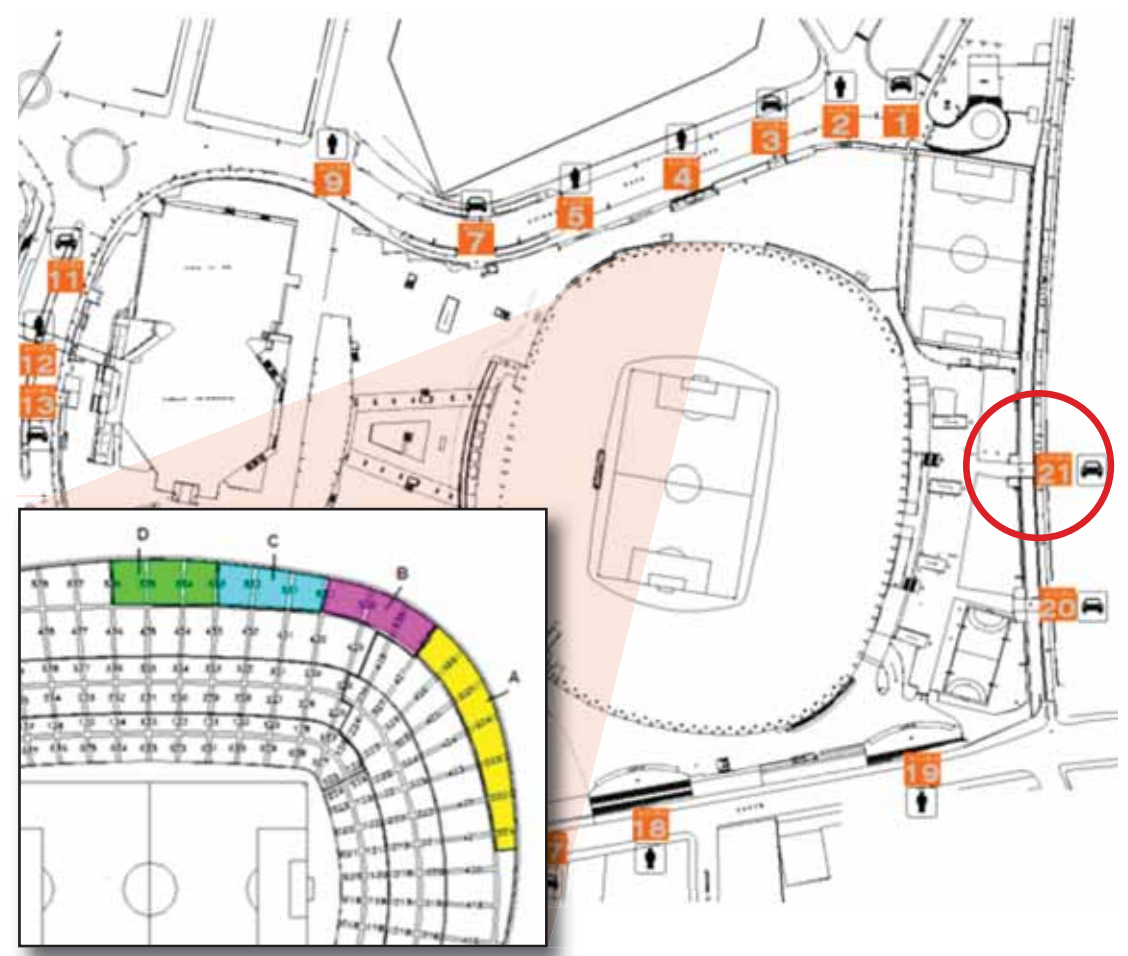


SUPPORTERS ARE ADVISED TO USE MARIA CRISTINA ON THE GREEN LINE TO ACCESS THE CAMP NOU.

STADIUM ACCESS



ACCESS 21 is the gate used for the Visiting Supporters arriving between 18:00 and 19:00

Arsenal supporters who arrive after 19:30 will have to queue longer to get into the stadium as the FC Barcelona supporters are also entering the stadium at that time. Body search is compulsory and will take as long as required to make sure that all visiting team supporters are searched thoroughly prior to entering the stadium.

Supporters who decide to turn up later than the recommended 18:00 to 19:00 at Access 21 risk missing Kick-off.

In past UEFA Champions League games, spectators arriving last minute have not been able to enter their seating area until 15-30 minutes after kick-off.

Arsenal Supporters will be held in for 30 minutes after the match, supporters will exit out of Access 1. Where Police will guide fans to the metro or coach Park for fans that are booked on official travel.

Access Procedure at Camp Nou for Arsenal Supporters

1. At Access 21 a visual ticket check and ticket tear-off
2. Then Arsenal Supporters will have a body search by Stewards but assisted by Police
3. Supporters accompanied to gates 46, 50, 51 and 52
4. Second ticket check with barcode at turnstiles to enter stadium

Barcelona is a friendly city that receives millions of tourists and visitors, and it has strong ties with the world of sport, having been the seat of important sports events. Consequently, we have a great deal of experience in the organisation of large celebrations.

In Barcelona we believe in peaceful coexistence and showing respect for public spaces. You should know that there are certain community standards that apply to everyone, both the people who live here and our visitors. The city puts a great deal of effort into the organisation of sports events, in economic terms, as regards cleaning, logistics, replacement of street furniture, and in social terms with reference to maintaining the quality of the city's streets and public spaces and upholding respect for them.

We have drawn up a series of measures so that **WHOEVER WINS ON THE PITCH, THE CITY WON'T LOSE.** We remind you that the event is in the football stadium, not in the city.

We inform you that the following behaviour is forbidden: consumption of alcoholic drinks in the street, public urination, and any type of behaviour that may disturb the peace, such as noisy or vandalistic behaviour. Likewise, spending the night in city squares or on beaches is also forbidden, and also buying and selling in the street.

So that you can enjoy your stay while you are waiting for the match to start, and to avoid large crowds of supporters, we have set up a "FANZONE" at the Olympic Port, next to the Arts Hotel and Mapfe building. An area specifically for supporters where you will find a whole range of entertaining, recreational and open-air activities.

We hope you enjoy your stay in Barcelona. Don't forget: fair play in the football stadium and in the city, as a sign of mutual respect. Please be advised that the Metro journey to Maria Cristina will take approx 45mins.
